REVENUE ENHANCEMENT STRATEGY

Switching off program -VKLM collects R2,5m

The switching off program of the Victor Khanye Local Municipality is effective. In a very short space of time the municipality collected more than R2, 5m from certain sector departments.

"There is no doubt that the switching off program is successful. Some sector departments, owing substantial amounts for water, electricity, rates and taxes responded after receiving letters of demand. Since April we have managed to collect more than R2, 5m from these departments," the Executive Mayor, Cllr. Eva Makhabane, said.

The next step would be to target individual households especially in Botleng Ext. 3 where the collection rate is at its lowest because of Eskom being the supplier and VKLM unable to implement its 50:50 Policy.

Asked about the municipality's Revenue

Enhancement Strategy the Executive Mayor said it is being developed and once approved, would be implemented. "The benefit derived from this strategy would enhance the collection of extra revenue which in turn, would lead to improved service delivery."

According to Cllr. Makhabane there will be no more interrupted water supply in 2014 now that the Delmas water purification plant and the Rand Water pipeline is operational.

Sanitation still remains a problem in informal settlements. However, the recent announcement by the Minister of Water Affairs, Edna Molewa, that the bucket system will be eradicated by

March next year would see then the end of this problem.

"VKLM hosted an even with various sector departments to celebrate 20 years of democracy under the theme, "South Africa is a much better place than it was in 1994".

Asked what role the municipality would play in next year's general election, the Executive Mayor said, "We will play a major role in this regard by working closely with the Independent Electoral Commission ensuring that our people are registered".

"We will also mobilize and educate our people regarding the importance of voting, Cllr Makhabane concludes.

"I bow my head in memory of citizens, friends and family who have passed on during 2013. May their memories be your guiding light and strength when you celebrate this Christmas without them?

"Whilst it is impossible to recall all the phenomenal achievements this past year, it is appropriate to ponder on some of the more important ones less we take them for granted:

 Through commitment 98 percent of all households have piped water; 83 percent have toilet facilities; 85 percent electricity, and 75 percent have access to waste collection

 The municipality's water supply is now stable through the Rand Water pipeline and the refurbishing of the water purification plant

Development Plan, Budget process and Mayoral Imbizos, interaction between the Council and community has improved. These forums also enhanced service delivery where it is most needed

 Ten mines are operational in the VKLM-area and provide jobs to 14 percent of the population

 The Risk Management Unit is fully functional ensuring accountable, clean and a more effective administration

The approved capital budget

amounts to R102, 6m, the operating budget, R292m and the total municipal budget, R394, 6m which is 18, 5 percent higher than the previous year.

Local Economic Development

Between July and October a total of 399 Small, Medium and Macro Enterprise (SMME) and Co-operatives were capacitated in various programmes – coordinated by the municipality in partnership with other sectors e.g. Standard Bank, DEDET, SARS and SANACO

The municipality facilitated the following: Tourism Development Programmes – Victor Khanye Memorial Lecture and the Tourist Expo. Delmas tourism brochure was launched and is being marketed regionally and nationally with the aim to put Delmas on the tourism map and increase tourism activities within the area to create more job opportunities

Social Labour Projects (Public, Private Partnerships

Some of the local Corporates have contributed back to the communities – Exxaro, 25 houses and the supported farming projects at Boschpoort, which currently employs six people

Youth development

A seminar on further training, education and skills development was held for 500 learners in grade 10, 11 and 12 from High Schools in and around VKLM. Career Expo in partnership with Vitrovien and Eskom sponsored the event.

A plumbing preparedness

learnership programme, dealing with aspects of plumbing was attended by 27 young people - a joint venture by NYDA and MRTT. Another 30 young people are currently attending a plumbing learnership and enterprise development programme hosted by M3 Engineering and SEDA

VKLM has just concluded an agreement with LIMCO Consulting (PTY) LTD to offer two learnerships, Business Administration and Information Technology Support, simultaneously. This learnerships will start in January 2014 and run for two years whereby some 50 young people would attend

"The New Year brings more hope and progress than most of us can imagine. Promises of total eradication of the bucket system, relocation and decent housing and services for those living in informal settlements, are but a few of the myriad of proposed projects you can expect".

"In 2014 we are going to the polls. The administration will assist where it can to ensure that voters are kept informed about election procedures and able to cast their vote".

2014 - THE YEAR

2014 - The year indigents would be properly housed and the end of the bucket system in VKLM

Indigents, inadequately housed, (living in shacks) would be relocated and properly housed while the bucket system in informal settlements would be totally eradicated by March 2014!



These commitments were made during the Imbizo Focus Week (7-13 October) held in the Victor Khanye Local Municipality (VKLM) by high ranking leaders namely the Minister for Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs, Lechesa Tsenoli, the Minister for Water Affairs, Edna Molewa, the Premier of Mpumalanga, David Mabuza and the Executive Mayor, Cllr Eva Makhabane - 2014 will indeed be a year of hope, restored dignity and improved living conditions for hundreds of less fortunate people in this progressive local municipality!

The Imbizo Focus Week was hosted by the Executive Mayor of the Victor Khanye Local Municipality, Eva Makhahane, in accordance with Cabinet's decision to reintroduce the bi-annual Imbizo Focus Week. Citizens of VKLM experienced this historic and memorable occasion whereby the National Bucket Eradication Program was also launched.

Formal settlement

Premier David Mabuza publically announced that people living in informal settlement in and around VKLM would be relocated to a formal settlement with full services by March 2014!,

He also extended the deadline for the relocation of these people from December this year to March next year. At the same time called upon the MEC for Human Settlement, Andries Gamede, to assist the municipality with the establishment of the new location which will have Reconstructed Development Programme (RDP) houses, water, electricity and roads.

Mabuza was full of praise for government's initiative regarding housing delivery, but expressed concern over the many people who are still living in informal settlement without basic services and decent accommodation.

"We must never forget that people living in informal settlement are being deprived of their dignity. To restore dignity amongst these people it is of paramount importance that the registration process commences immediately.

"I'm putting my head on a block. Come rain, come sunshine, whether at night or by day, but by March next year you will move to your new formal settlement with the necessary infrastructure.

"Today I am making a Vezimfundo High School Accord. This government will provide you with a new home. However, in the interim, you must not build new shacks. The Ruling Party entered into a contract with you that it will change your lives for the better, and this contract would be fulfilled by March next year," the Premier said emphatically.

During his visit, the Premier accompanied by the two ministers handed over more than 800 RDP title housing deeds, while 25 luxurious and up market houses sponsored by a local mining company, Exxaro, were also handed over.

The Premier has also donated beds, while the municipality supplied the curtains for Premier Mabuza's Kancane Kancane Housing Project

Earlier this year, the Minister for Water Affairs, Edna Molewa, announced a multi-million Rand Water Project for VKLM while all RDP houses would have water borne toilets preventing water related disease.



End of bucket system in informal settlements!

The eradication of the bucket system - a most degrading and unhygienic era in South Africa - in all the informal settlements in the Victor Khanye Local Municipality, is being envisaged by March 2014.

Government recently launched its National Bucket Eradication Campaign during an Imbizo Focus Week hosted by the Victor Khanye Local Municipality in Delmas.

The Minister of Water Affairs, Edna Molewa, announced that by the end of March 2014 the bucket system in all informal settlements in this municipality would be something of the past.

"The Minister of Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs, Lechese Tsenoli, would be driving the bucket eradication campaign in the Delmas area," Molewa said.

She pointed out that the Delmas area had a history of waterborne diseases, but with the eradication of the bucket system and the implementation of water borne toilets such related water diseases should belong to the past.

Molewa referred to some of the water projects in the municipality namely the multi-million Rand Water Project which would supplement the municipality's water supply by an additional 25 000 litres per day via a 37,2 kilometer pipeline.

Other water related projects in the area



would include the drilling and equipping of an additional 17 boreholes and the refurbishing of the waste water treatment plant, "These water projects are part of national government's promise to the people that it would improve their lives. At the same time acknowledge the importance of water in the social-economic development of

communities,

"I believe that what we are doing here in Delmas is a huge step towards ensuring security in the supply of water and that the eradication of the bucket system would surely have sufficient support to ensure longevity," said Molewa.

Sod turning - Premier Mabuza comes through



In October, during the Imbizo Focus Week, the Premier of Mpumalanga, David Mabuza, promised to relocate people living in informal settlements in the Victor Khanye Local Municipality by March 2014 – 18 days later, part of this promise came true through a sod turning ceremony signaling the start of a major housing development project

This historic event saw Victor Khanye Local Municipality's Executive Mayor, Cllr. Eva Makhabane, turn the first sod of the proposed formal housing project in Ext. 5 - comprising of 1 231 fully serviced stands.

"The eradication of the housing backlog

has been a major challenge for the municipality. We have taken the initiative to eradicate surrounding informal settlements. This historic event is the first step towards providing services and decent homes to those citizens living in informal settlements," Cllr. Makhabane

This historic ceremony is visible evidence of VKLM's and the Premier's commitment to relocate people poorly housed in a formal settlement with decent houses and services.



WE WILL REMEMBER...

Victor Khanye - gallant fighter, revolutionary and selfless leader

VICTOR KHANYE - the man who in 1990 together with civil rights leader, Judas Mithimunye, led a protest march of some 6 000 people of all walks of life, demanding from the spartheid regime at that time, a seamless local authority, abolishment of the town committees, access to education and the allocation of more land for housing.

The role which the late Victor Khanye, played in changing the face of local government in Delmas and after which one of South Africa's most progressive local municipalities, the Victor Khanye Local Municipality is named, was once again brought to the fore at a memorial lecture in his honour.

This year's theme "Following the Life and Times of Victor," was attended by members of his family, learners, past teachers and fellow cadres reliving the phenomenal role this gallant fighter, revolutionary and selfless leader played in transforming a non-participatory form of government into a democratic and participatory local government in Delmas from 1990 up to the time of his untimely passing in 1998,

Victor's achievements:

Victor was part of the team

who negotiated in favour of a Delmas Transitional Local Council (TLC). Also played a important role in the amalgamation of the Botleng Town Committee and the former Delmas

His dynamic leadership saw him elected as TLC councilor representing the African National Congress. He later became a member of the Council Executive Committee, at the time the highest decision making body

In 1996 he became a Proportional Representative Councillor and later became the Deputy Chairperson of the Council

Victor's untimely death robbed him to serve as a Member of Parliament

of the Republic of South Africa Was co-founder and the first Consolidation Coordinator of the Botleng Development Association which aim was to mobilize project

funding such as feeding schemes, training of health workers, funding students and enticing developers to invest in Delmas. Together with comembers SDP Skhosana, James Mhlongo and others played a pivot role in getting Cash Built, Irvin and Johnson to

invest in Delmas Victor secured funds for



 Victor secured funds for bursaries for promising students. Among them Floyed Mashele who has completed his Civil Engineering studies and Steven Ngubeni, who graduated as Regional Town Planner

His vision was to see Delmas/Botleng expanding towards the N12 freeway, traversing Delmas and linking Johannesburg with Witbank, Milddelburg and Nelspruit. He argued that a small town like Delmas at the time, would only attract investors if it develop towards the freeway, proving easy access to and from the town

His mother recalls that tragic Sunday when Victor Khanye passed on. "Late on that Sunday, the late Sbulayi Skhosana told me of Victor's tragic passing. We all then realized, that we were robbed of a gallant fighter, a revolutionary and a selfless leader..."

"His spirit shall continue to direct the future development and growth of Delmas and its citizens; his sole, the radar for future leaders; his selflessness to inspire us all to unite in progress."

Fire service - a mean outfit!

The fire service of the Victor Khanye Local Municipality (VKLM) has over the past ten years grown in stature and service excellence. From four members and two vehicle service, it has grown into a 24/7 emergency call centre, Station and Chief Fire Officer, trained fire fighters, a compliment of volunteers, fleet of three fire appliances, response unit and three veldt fire response vehicles.

Said the Chief Fire Officer, Frans Bolton "It was hard work, motivation and dedication to grow the service as we have done over the past ten years with limited resources at our disposal.

There are many challenges such as the availability of resources due to the cost factor. There is also an urgent need for a fully functional fire station, additional fire personnel and at least two fire houses in this area. But here again, the availability of funds place a damper on these necessities," the Chief Fire Officer, Frans Bolton explained.

The service is working hand-in hand with the Nkangala District Municipality and the Provincial Disaster Management Centre to ensure that the focus remains on preventative rather than responsive measures.

"Regular awareness visits are conducted at schools, in particular primary and preprimary schools. Three major disaster management awareness campaigns were conducted and through these campaigns we reached an array of people regarding disaster management," he explained.

VKLM also conducted a large disaster management exercise on the N12 to demonstrate the efficiency of its service during a major disaster. "This exercise was a huge success and we received praise for it from the Province."

Bolton also cited the high unemployment and illiteracy rate in VKLM as another



major obstacle towards rendering an effective fire services. "A large percentage of the community is unemployed and cannot read. They also do not know the emergency numbers. These factors contribute largely towards delays before services could be dispatched in most instances total destruction of property," he said.

Equitable share

Asked how the service is coping in procuring essential equipment, Bolton explained that the municipality provides an annual budget but most of the budget is forthcoming from the Nkangala District Municipality. Government's equitable share has also been stopped.

"There are not many suppliers of firefighting equipment in the country. Most of the equipment must be imported which are extremely expensive and time consuming which in itself presents a challenge," Bolton concludes.

Responsibilities

Other than actual fire fighting the fire service is also responsible for:

- Maintenance of vehicles and equipment
- Ensure trained staff are available to respond to emergencies
- Fire risk assessments
- Fire safety inspections
- Law enforcement
- Disaster Management
- Training and awareness campaigns and fire fighting demonstrations

In less than EIGHT minutes fire can destroy informal dwellings

"The fire risk in informal settlements are huge due to dwellings being constructed of highly combustible material and could be destroyed in less than eight minutes".

"Compounding the fire risk further is that the community tries to put out the fire instead of first calling the fire department. Another problem causing delays in the fire department's response time, is that the South African Police Services are called out to assist and in many instances people also phone the wrong number."

So said the Chief Fire Officer of the Victor Khanye Local Municipality (VKLM), FJ Bolton, when asked about the many challenges his department has to overcome.

He cited access to houses as another major challenge because of the passages between houses being too narrow to reach a burning building, "However the fire department is fortunate that the frequency of fires in informal settlements is fairly low. Four per month in the winter season and maybe one a month in the summer season," he said.

Communities admitted that they do not know the fire department's number and either call 10111 or 112 which are frequently not answered.

Veldt fires

According to Bolton, veldt fires are mostly caused through negligence by land owners. Provincial bylaws are in place, but it is difficult to enforce, as many land owners still fail to comply. However some cases did end up in court and heavy fines imposed.

He pointed out that the municipality does respond to veldt fires, however, in accordance with the National Veldt and Forest Fire Act, land owners are responsible to prevent veldt fires on their property in the first instance and not just phone the fire department to assist in fighting veldt fires.

The fire services have three vehicles equipped to attend to veldt fires and one fire pumper designed for off-road use and a fire

tanker for fighting large fires

"The Fire Protection Association, on which the municipality is represented, allows for equipment to be made available to fight veldt fires of paid-up registered members in high risk areas," the Fire Chief explained.

Do Not...

Let us, in formal and informal settlements, make this festive season a fire emergency free time. If readers obey the following DO's and DON'T's, the fire department would also have an enjoyable festive season.

- · Do not leave fires unattended. Make sure the fire is put out properly
- Make sure that all electrical connections on your Christmas tree is safe, do not
 put the tree near combustible material, power supply or a transformer, as the
 heat from the lights could cause a fire
- Do not make a too large fire outside and make sure it is far away from a thatch roof
- Always ensure that there are means nearby to extinguish a fire in the event of an emergency. Make sure your fire extinguisher is in a good working order
- Place the fire emergency numbers in a place where everybody can see it. (The emergency numbers appear on page 14)
- The lighting of fireworks is controlled. No fire works can be discharged within a built-up area and you need permissions from the Chief Fire Officer
- Do not hold fireworks in your hand while it is lit, it can explode and cause severe injuries
- · Do not let children play with fireworks
- Unplug all non-essential electrical appliances before you go on holiday
- Refrain from drinking and driving. It is really not worth it even if you are fortunate not to be caught or cause and accident. What if you do? If you are going to over indulge, get a responsible and sober person to drive you home

accidents, 1 848 in total of which 25 were serious resulting in 1i fatalities I must conclude that bad driving behavior is a concern," she said.

Statistics, released by the Chief Fire Officer of Victor Khanye Local Municipality, Frans Bolton, for the first nine month of 2013 shows that the department's activities was not restricted to fighting fires alone, but an array of emergencies.

The total man hours spend on fire incidents for the period under review was 1225; on collisions 875. No fatalities during fires were recorded but 18 people died in road accidents.

Fints for saving electricity!

The electricity supply is ALWAYS under pressure even during summer. It is every South African's duty to try and save as much electricity in his/her home as possible. Apply some of the mentioned hints, it is the right thing to do!

- Switch off lights not needed. Unplug all electricity appliances. If you have a geyser then turn the geyser to 60 degrees. Use warm water sparingly
- The average kettle operates on +- 1900 watts. The more water you boil the more electricity you uses. Only boil water you need at the moment
- Energy efficient lighting options are readily available. LED and CFL light bulbs consume much less electricity than convention light bulbs and last six to eight times longer
- Use a thermostat controlled iron and iron large batches of clothes in one go. The average iron uses the same amount of electricity as ten 100 watt light bulbs
- Install a heat pump and cut your heating costs up to 60 present compared to a regular geyser
- For every hour you use your tumble dryer you could have cooked 48 meals in your microwave more than a month's dinners
